Edel Carey from The Irish Wheelchair Association will visit the school in June.




Green Flag News

The Green Flag Committee have been very busy over the last few months conducting an Environmental Review to assess the initial situation within the school regarding water and to identify areas for improvement. Various members of the committee have calculated water usage by reading the water meter on a daily/weekly basis, they have investigated areas that have the greatest potential for wastage of water and conducted leak tests. We have a 'Water squad' who regularly ensure taps are being turned off and report any leaking or dripping taps, toilets etc

Children from First to Sixth class took part in the Green School Irish Water poster competition where they illustrated the theme: "Local Water Actions for Global Change". They also participated in a "Walk for Water" around the Fairfield on March 23rd to mark World Water Day. It was completed in solidarity with women and children in other parts of the world who must regularly walk up to six miles a day to fetch water for their families.

Children in all classes are learning about the theme of water through a variety of curricular work going on in school. A questionnaire has been compiled which will be send to all parents soon to investigate the amount of water being used in our homes on a regular basis. The committee then plan to follow that up with a leaflet containing information tips for all families!
